







Editorial




A Novel Approach: Breakfast, Lunch, and Afternoon Tea Discussions with Digital Skills Experts

Liège Declaration: Towards affordable, decent, and sustainable housing for all

- Best practices in resilient renovation and construction programs aligned with climate change;
- -- Diversification of funding sources: European recovery programs "Next GENERATION EU", zero-interest loans from the European Investment Bank, inclusion of private and alternative financing in programs for creating and renovating affordable and social housing for all. more info

Danube Region Programme 2nd Call for Proposals

The 2nd call for proposals of the Danube Region Programme is open from the 2 November 2023 until the 29 March 2024. The 2nd call is organised according to a one-step procedure where the applicants have to submit an application package, including a fully developed Application Form by 29 March 2024, 14:0 PROGRAMME SUPPORT FOR APPLICANTS

Applicants can request individual consultations for their project ideas with the MA/JS by sending an email to the Project Officer in charge of the programme specific objective addressed in their project proposal. For general advice and information, we recommend to consult the respective National Contact Point.

New <u>matchmaking platform</u>- to help applicants find the right project partners and allow organisations within the programme's geographical area to join projects applying to the open call for proposal.

The European Festivals Fund for Emerging Artists - EFFEA, an initiative of the European Festivals Association, opens a call to festivals to support emerging artists across Europe. EFFEA is a system built to empower festivals and offer emerging artists a platform to establish themselves on the international stage.

EFFEA Call#3 will support approximately **50 residencies** involving 50 emerging artists in the seat of 50 leading festivals in collaboration with a minimum of **one** (Discovery category) or **two partner festivals** (Springboard category) each. Approximately **40 grants of 8.000€** will be awarded under the Discovery category and **10 grants of 15.000€** will be allocated to the Springboard category. The artistic residencies should take place between 1 June 2024 and 31 May 2025.

SEED MONEY FACILITY CALL is now open

Another relevant funding opportunity within the Danube Region Programme is now open - from 27 November, 2023 until 29 March, 2024.EUSDR Seed money facility (SMF) shall serve as a tool for kick-starting development of projects in line with the 12 priority areas of the EU Strategy for the Danube Region. Proposals submitted under the SMF call shall be aligned to at least one EUSDR PA and shall clearly address the EUSDR action plan and targets.

The objective of the seed money facility support is to prepare projects for further funding sources, regardless the financial instrument to be addressed by the project developed, be it national, mainstream EU, transnational or cross border or by any other public or private investor (such as IFIs) or public-private partnership available in the Danube Region.

Culture/heritage

Cities must use all of the resources available to them to improve citizens' quality of life, whether digital, physical or cultural. In Újbuda (HU), culture and digital platforms were combined to create a bottom-up creative cultural resource management tool to strengthen social cohesion. Alongside the digital sphere, a physical cultural institution was created, integrating local cultural and technological initiatives, bringing together the local community, public and private sectors. Cities can explore low-budget interventions as well as major investments. Chalandri (EL) focused on an ancient monument - in their case, the Hadrian Aqueduct - as a vehicle for urban regeneration and revitalising community life. Using a cross-sectoral approach, it co-creates local projects and cultural events with communities, valorising local history and improving care of water and natural resources. It can be adapted to other cities with different types of local heritage, to build trust and nurture communities. In Tilburg (NL), the city uses culture as an agent for social transformation. Developing a cultural ecosystem in an ethnically mixed and disadvantaged area helps bridge the gap between those in the margins, and the public services they interact with. More than 3 000 young people were reached through 150 projects, with positive effects on health, behaviour and public safety. More info here

"Danubius Young Scientist Award" competition is now open for nominations!

14 young scientists will be granted this award - one for each country that is part of the EU Strategy for the Danube Region [Austria, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Czech Republic, Germany, Hungary, Moldova, Montenegro, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia, Romania and Ukraine]*.

The award seeks to highlight the scientific work and talent of young researchers and enhance the visibility of the scientific community in the region. Moreover, the award encourages young scientists to engage in the scientific examination of the multifaceted issues and questions specifically related to the Danube Region.

Project of the Month

Debate on Integrating diversity and multilingualism in the elaboration of local/regional strategies.

The initiative is part of the project PA3_CLOSE - Recovery through CuLture, tOuriSm and peoplE-to-people contacts in the Danube Region and aims to give greater visibility to the cultural dimensions of the **Priority Areas 3-culture, tourism and people to people contacts** of the European Union Strategy for the Danube Region, including activities and objectives that have an impact on the cultural and linguistic identity of communities in the Danube Region and the role of these components in the development of local and regional strategies.

The contribution of diversity and multilingualism to the full expression of local/regional linguistic diversity; diversity and multilingualism as a key factor in the implementation of local and regional strategies; enhancing the linguistic and cultural potential of the region, essential for local cohesion; moving towards mutual understanding of coexisting cultures will be the overall objectives of the debate.

The debate will be organised in the form of a 4-hour panel discussion in a hybrid format.

Have you heard of Poesiomats?

A Czech invention that brings an innovative twist to the concept of urban furniture

They look like black periscopes sticking out of the ground and observing the urban landscape around them. Or they could be confused with an air pipe that connects to some grid hidden in the Netherlands. Meet the **Poesiomats** – **the urban poetry machines** that have taken over most of the cities in the Czech Republic, and recently also other places around the world.

The idea behind the Poesiomat, invented by café owner and cultural activist Ondřej Kobza, was to create a sort of **publicly accessible jukebox** for spoken word culture.

The first one of this type was installed in Prague's Míru Square in 2015 and since then they have become a common feature in other Czech cities, towns, villages and even castles.

Lending an ear to culture

The aim of the Poesiomat is to revive the appeal of poetry by making it easily accessible to the masses. According to the initiative's website, the poetry machines, however, can also contain lyrics, songs and sounds related to the specific place they are located in. In essence, that means that no two are alike in terms of their cultural content.

The poetry machines are made of steel and are about 180 cm tall, consisting of three assembled parts. Inside each of them there's a speaker and electronic software which contains 20 different mp3 files. Passers-by can spin a handle jutting out from one side of the machine and choose what to play.

On the photos, you see the Poesiomat in Brno, Czechia's second city. You will find it on Bratislavska Street there and you can hear Czech poets who had been interned in the local prison, authentic memories of political prisoners, but also poems, songs and texts of contemporary Czech and Roma authors.

strengthening cohesion. COMMHERITOUR's transnational end-product is the HeriCraft Market, a digital platform of cross-cultural networking, showcasing crafts-related tourism attractions, sharing methods, inventions, and skill development curricula.



Interreg IPA Romania-Serbia Programme- Unveil the Mysteries at Parta Neolithic Sanctuary!

The Oldest Sanctuary in the Banat region holds a mystical attractiveness, inviting curious people to unravel the secrets of the past. Parta Neolithic Sanctuary, a sacred testament spanning 6,000 years, stands as a silent witness to those who once stepped onto the primaeval lands along the Timis River.

Using financial support from the European Union, the National Museum of Banat, in partnership with the Timis County Council and the Municipality of Novi Knezevac, succeeded in improving the Romanian-Serbian cross-border cultural infrastructure by building a new museum in the village of Parta that holds a one-to-one replica of the original sanctuary, safely protected by the museum`s curators.

Now, the National Museum of Banat extends an open invitation to all history enthusiasts, inviting people to join free tours of the fascinating Vinča-Turdaş culture. This Neolithic archaeological marvel from Southeast Europe dates back to 5400-4500 BC when our ancestors shaped the very fabric of civilization.

The new call "Youth4cooperation: the future of cooperation" is now open for proposals! DEADLINE: 3 April 2024

This call for proposals of the European Commission has the objective of selecting three beneficiaries which will secure the involvement of young people as a horizontal priority in territorial cooperation within Cohesion Policy. The inclusion of young people in the consultations will help shaping the post-2027 period, to make sure that youth voices and needs are fully taken into consideration in the next programming period 2028-2034. The voices of young people will be a positive and valuable addition to the reflection on the next for territorial cooperation.

So, are you an organisation working with youth in the pan-European scope? Are you interested in the future of regional policy and cooperation? Then this is your chance to consult young people and make their voice heard on the future of cooperation in Europe.

The three selected organisations will get EUR 10.000 each to use digital tools like social media, surveys and online workshops to conduct consultations towards young people, based on a set of questions elaborated by DG REGIO. The results of consultations will feed the next European Commission's proposal.

Macro-Regional Strategies promote Cohesion Policy



Commissioner Elisa Ferreira initiated the setting up of a High-Level Group on the Future of Cohesion Policy composed by representatives of academia, national, regional and local policitians, socio-economic partners and civil society. Throughout 2023 the Group reflected on how to develop and reform Cohesion Policy and on 20 February 2024 published its conclusions and recommendations in its final report "Forging a sustainable future together: cohesion for a competitive and inclusive Europe".

Chapter 3.2.4. of the Report: "A policy without borders" calls for the intensification of cross-border integration and cooperation. The reformed Cohesion Policy should focus on increasing the budget and enhancing coordination and concentration including use of macro-regional strategies or interregional cooperation to transfer good practices. It is rewarding to see that the macro-regional strategies are positively seen by the Report.

Against this backdrop it should be noted that the Commission will publish its 9th Report on economic, social and territorial cohesion soon and the reflection on the future of Cohesion Policy will continue at the Cohesion Forum to be held in Brussels on 11-12 April 2024.
